Councilman Papalas: I want to ask about the progress on the bike trail, Mark?

Mr. Mark Hess: Right now the bike trail is approved and we are finalizing all the agreements and we have made the payments to the railroads that we needed to make. The only thing that I am waiting for is the signed documents that Terry is working on and once we do that we will be able to certify the right of way. In the mean time we are moving forward with the things that ODOT wants us to do now that we are pulling that project back out of construction. We are looking at getting this to bid in March of this year. We are working hard to get it done.

Councilman McCormick: Hopefully you will start construction the first part of summer? How long will it stay up for bid?

Mr. Hess: The bid process takes about a month to six weeks. So, if we start bidding in March we could start construction some time in June.

Councilman Scarnecchia: Mayor, looking outside at the weather I just have to ask how our salt and slag supply is.

Mayor Infante: Good, before our last contract was up we loaded up a whole years worth of salt at thirty eight dollars a ton. The new contract is at sixty eight dollars and we got the whole seven hundred ton.
