Mr. Steffey: Chief, all the vehicles that are in the impound lot currently today, are those all towed vehicles?

Chief Holland: Yes.

Mr. Steffey: It looks like a car lot in there and they're double parked. I went by there on the way here and it has to be producing much greater than anticipated. Great job.

Chief Holland: Unclaimed cars, once we get the titles for them (inaudible) we will clear about another \$4,000.00 out of that when the cars are auctioned off.

Mr. Steffey: Well, I'll tell you some of the quality of the cars that are in there, they are new models and hats off to your department for moving forward with that program and help us.

Mr. Pezzano: Yes, Chief, especially after a certain local paper kind of put that down on us. Great job.

That is just to get them through a month, but we wanted to make sure that they had the resources and Council is committed to fully funding that to the best of their ability, so I appreciate Council adding this to the Agenda and committing yourselves to helping the drug until. That is very important.

Mr. Mientkiewicz: How much have we appropriated thus far?

Chief Holland: (inaudible) probably \$5,000.00

Mr. Mientkiewicz: This isn't the first round, is it?

Mr. Steffey: Second.

Ms. Marchese: We gave \$5,000.00 one time before if I can remember right.

Chief Holland: We're running out of money.

Ms. Marchese: Right.

Chief Holland: When we have a raid, it costs us probably \$800.00 to get a warrant, so it's not cheap to get in those houses.

MISCELLANEOUS REMARKS

President Marino: I would like to let Council know earlier today the Auditor, the Safety Service Director, Law Director, Auditor and our Grant Coordinator did go out to the pool, take a walk around and I asked that the Safety Service Director and Auditor contact our insurance company to get a walk through to get an insurability analysis and then I asked that they start getting a plan together to present and getting the Building and Grounds Committee or Public Works Committee involved. Once we gather the information, Linda, they will be getting ahold of you for you to schedule a meeting relative to the grant and proceeding. It's at my request that we do this because I think it is better and more prudent that we approach things strategically and we have a plan before we launch into things. I know how this town works, I know how the rumor mill works and I feel compelled to inform Council that those things are moving.

Mayor Scarnecchia: Tomorrow, Thursday, there will be the board meeting of the Wellness Center at the Wellness Center at 5:00 p.m. or after. That's all I have.

President Marino: I will have to be excused from that. I can't make it and I apologize.

Chief Danielson: I want to thank everyone for passing the S.A.F.E.R. Grant. The new fire truck is (inaudible).

Auditor Merlo: Just so everyone is aware, since Council has made the adjustment, we will be able to complete the 2015 audit and we'll submit that to the auditors tomorrow. The general fund portion of that was a lot less than we anticipated. We paid over \$200,000.00 for 2014. We'll pay a little under \$91,000.00 from the general fund balance, so by the end of September or sometime in October, the audit should be released to the public.

Mr. Papalas: I have some comments. Mr. Mayor, is the Service Director coming back in?

Mayor Scarnecchia: No. I think he left. Do you want me to give him a message?

Mr. Papalas: Well, I'll address these questions to you to comment. I'm disappointed that last week the TAP meeting in Youngstown, the committee that deals with grants and allocating substantial amounts of money to various communities, we didn't have anybody there again. That was so crucial to have somebody there. I don't know if you know how important it is.

Mayor Scarnecchia: I know. Kevin was assigned to go to theses and he was eager to go and he's been talking to Mark. I can't believe that he didn't go.

Mr. Papalas: We had one person from this room who went to observe and if that person wants to make a statement, that's fine, but I'm very upset that we don't have adequate representation. Is this person interested enough to do the job or should we find somebody else?

Mayor Scarnecchia: I don't know.

Mr. Papalas: Mayor, you need to let us know about this. Do we need somebody else to do the job? I was told that when it came to Eastgate meetings, I asked the question in May or June are we attending these meetings, and Jim said yes almost every one of them. I told him that I heard we were not present at these meetings and he asked me something like do I even know what this fellow looks like. Of course, I don't. So you know what I did, Mayor? I've been carrying these around. I went and got the sign-in sheets for each meeting from January through June. Mayor, these are all the sign-in sheets and they're loaded with the names of people, public officials, elected officials, service directors and so forth from cities and villages and townships in Mahoning County and Trumbull County and we are not on a single page. We never attended any of those meetings. Nobody was there representing the City of Niles and so we didn't get funding. Now, the funding for Eastgate, if apply next year, it won't be coming into the city until the year 2021. We did Warren Avenue and Niles Vienna Road with funding from this source because Mark Hess did his job diligently. We had nobody there. If you will permit me, I just want to read a couple of things to illustrate to you the kind of money coming into communities in just Trumbull County for road projects and so forth. Can I read this? You'll be stunned.

So Mayor, I have to ask, where's our share? Not a dime.

Mayor Scarnecchia: Councilman, I do want to say this, when we lost Mark Hess, we lost so much. Mark took care of that for many many years and he was great at doing it. All we have left -- there is not a position, that position was abolished -- all we had left is we have a gentleman that we are trying to bring into it, he's a draftsman and he's also going towards his PE at school and we're trying to break him in. We don't have money for having a grant coordinator. That was dissolved under the last administration.

Mr. Papalas: Stop. Didn't Mark Hess offer to help this fella and bring him along and train him? And he has been talking to him.

Mayor Scarnecchia: He has been talking to him.

Mr. Papalas: We need somebody at the table. That's the key.

Mayor Scarnecchia: You're right.

Mr. Papalas: And there are other people who are willing to help. Eastgate and the people from TAP were looking for the person from Niles so they could sit down with them and say hey, how can we help you with the pot? Nobody was there and so the money went to other places last week; these places. Do you understand?

Mayor Scarnecchia: I understand totally what you're saying.

Mr. Papalas: What are we going then about this fella that doesn't show up?

Mayor Scarnecchia: That I want to look into because he told me personally that he's been going to the meetings and Eastgate and the other one in Youngstown, I don't know nothing about.

Mr. Papalas: The Service Director knows.

Mayor Scarnecchia: Well, I'll question him tomorrow about this and we will get back to you on this. I know how important this is because I know grants. Today I just signed that manhole grant that we're getting 60% of.

Auditor Merlo: 80%.

Mayor Scarnecchia: What?

Auditor Merlo: We're getting 80%.

Mayor Scarnecchia: I just came back. That was on my desk today and I signed it mailed it back to Ohio.

Mr. Papalas: There are other sources, but you have to attend the Eastgate meetings to get plugged in.

Auditor Merlo: Steve, back in July (inaudible) the one meeting that Mark was at (inaudible) in August, I took Kevin myself to the meeting so he was at that meeting. This past meeting I did mention it to him and I e-mailed Lisa to make sure that (inaudible).

Mr. Papalas: My information is and I'm hearing it second hand, that the day before he knew.

Mr. Mientkiewicz: It's coming firsthand because I was the one at the TAP meeting and I was the one that spoke to the person who invited him. Just to reiterate, it is an absolute necessity, Mayor. We have to do something yesterday to move this forward and despite everything that's been going on since Mark left, these people are willing to help us. They want to give us money. They don't want to talk to Jimmy or you or the Auditor. They want one point person. They want a Mark Hess.

Mayor Scarnecchia: I'd love to have a Mark Hess. You as council would you be willing, if we find somebody who wants and is willing to do that with the experience and everything, are you willing to pay a person like this. We are paying a draftsman to do this stuff.

Mr. Pezzano: Mr. Mayor, I have had conversations with our Trumbull County Engineer and after speaking with him, he is willing to help us out.

Mayor Scarnecchia: He's been wonderful with us.

Mr. Pezzano: Right and also every time there's something and he wants a time frame, I went to Mr. DePasquale and reminded him, take Kevin to this and I know Randy, the door is open to him.

Mr. Papalas: Kevin needs to show up and do a little work. If he doesn't want to do the work then you better send him somewhere else. He's in the wrong place.

Mayor Scarnecchia: I thought he was working with Eastgate pretty good. I'm sorry that I didn't know that now, Steve, but now we know and we'll do something about it.

Mr. Papalas: We need to talk about getting somebody else in by all means. We can't have smaller communities getting a million dollars and we don't have anybody because the guy is not showing up.

Mayor Scarnecchia: I agree with you 100%. I know how important this is.

Mr. Papalas: Ok. I'm not going to beat a dead horse any further. We need progress from you.

Mr. Mientkiewicz: Remind our person that the first Thursday of every month is the TAP meeting. It's been like that for years. The first Thursday of every month. Anyone who's remotely involved knows that, but it's imperative that we get the ball rolling and if this person doesn't want to, then we have to find someone ASAP.

Mayor Scarnecchia: He wants too and every time I see him I ask him are you getting on this now and he said yes, I'm working on it. If he's not then we have to look because that's the only way we can get more money for this city and I've been out looking. The impound lot was my thought and that's making money. How many more ways are we going to make money without cutting more? It's just that every month something else hits us on the head like mold and water. We've been fighting and it hasn't been easy.

Mr. Papalas: We know that, Mayor.

Mr. McNaughton: I won't pile on, but I'll just talk in general terms. Most of us in here have full time jobs, have this for a job, find ways to attend meetings, raising kids, find a way. We need people in the city who if they say they're going to do something, then do it. We're willing to work with you and your administration in any way. I agree if somebody is saying they'll do A and they're doing B, we can't do that. No one should. We can't do that, so that's that. All I want to say tonight is I want to publicly thank folks who came to my town hall a week and a half ago. Thanks for your generosity. We were able to raise \$700.00 to \$800.00 for Niles Football

Mothers to help rebuild the building that was burned down, so I just wanted to thank everybody who was willing to do that and I appreciate it and that's all I have.

Mr. Papalas: Mr. Chairman, just one other thing I want to say. Frank Pezzano had a rather dangerous experience and I just want to say it's good to see him and welcome back.

Mr. Pezzano: Thank you, Mr. Papalas and everybody.

Mr. Steffey: I would just echo that it's very nice to have Mr. Pezzano back.

Ms. Marchese: I have one quick question, but I'll probably be asking it tomorrow night also, the Wellness Center, being we do not have a director, who is signing the contracts for the people that are coming there? Are they coming to your office?

Mayor Scarnecchia: No, that's something that we're going to discuss because we need a committee (inaudible) somebody to sit in to sign the contracts. We're going to discuss that tomorrow.

Mr. McNaughton: Are you currently signing them?

Ms. Marchese: Do you sign those contracts?

Mr. McNaughton: Do you currently sign them?

Mayor Scarnecchia: No.

Ms. Marchese: So nobody -

Mr. McNaughton: So kindly answer her question, who is signing them?

Ms. Marchese: If he is not a director, how is he taking it upon himself to sign the contracts?

Mayor Scarnecchia: He's been doing that for years, right Terry?

Mr. Dull: Right. (inaudible)

Mr. McNaughton: But we all know he is doing full time work under the office of scheduling, but if we don't have someone —

Ms. Marchese: They should be coming to the Mayor or they should be coming to Council? That's council's money and that's a big deal —

President Marino: It's not necessarily council. In all due fairness to Scott, the plan that was presented by the former administration was a system set up for failure. The Auditor said it, I said it, others have said it and until there is a long term solution to that facility, we're going to encounter the frustrations that you're speaking of. I feel bad I cannot be there tomorrow, but like

Ryan said, we all have lives and this has turned out to be a real full time job for me here and in my real life, so Tom I hope you have a comprehensive plan to address the facility.

Mayor Scarnecchia: That is being worked on, but we are going to discuss it before we put in writing.

President Marino: Did we approve the new contract for the vendor that provides (inaudible) out there? We haven't done that yet?

Mr. Dull: That's supposed to be discussed tomorrow.

President Marino: Ok. I can't be there.

Mr. Mientkiewicz: Mayor, could you consult with the Service Director about contracting with a concrete company to repair sidewalks that were dug up because of water breakage. Do you know if he has done that? He told me three weeks ago that that was supposed to be done and it hasn't. I have someone on Sunny Estates since April who has a section of their sidewalk missing and nothing has been done about that so we need to get a move on that. Would you relay that message to Mr. DePasquale?

Mayor Scarnecchia: I will talk to him.

Mr. Pezzano: I just want to thank my colleagues for their support and am glad to be back.
