AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CODIFIED ORDINANCE NO. 191.081 BY RETROACTIVLY ADJUSTING THE CREDIT TO RESIDENTS FOR MUNICIPAL INCOME TAXES PAID TO ANOTHER MUNICIPALITY; AND, DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

Whereas, existing Codified Ordinance Section 191.081 allows residents of the City who receive taxable income for work done or services performed or rendered outside of the City a credit up to a maximum levy of one and one-half percent (1 1/2%) against the City income tax in the amount so paid by the resident to such other city; and,

Whereas, the passage of a levy increased the income tax, effective July 1, 2016, to two percent (2%); and,

Whereas, there remained the possibility of a one half percent (.50%) difference in the allowed tax credit; and,

Whereas, Council finds it is in the best interest of the residents of the City of Niles to retroactively match the tax credit paid to another municipality to the city's current income tax.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NILES, STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION 1: That Section 191.081 of Chapter 191 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Niles, be and herby is, repealed in its entirety.

SECTION 2: That Section 191.081 be, and thereof, be, and the same hereby is, reenacted to and within the Title 9, Earned Income Tax Chapter of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Niles as follows:

"191.081 Credit for Tax Paid to Another Municipality.

a. Every individual taxpayer who resides in the City who receives net profits, salaries, wages, commissions or other compensation for work done or services performed or rendered in another municipality and who has paid an income tax directly to such municipality on such net profits, salaries, wages, commissions or other compensation shall be allowed a credit on the amount paid to such other municipality up to a maximum of the city's present tax rate; provided, however, such credit shall only be allowable to the extent such tax is paid to another municipality on the income subject to the tax imposed by this chapter; and provided further that no credit shall be allowable for any overpayment of tax to another municipality."

SECTION 3: Said tax credit hereby stated in Section One is retroactively effective to the 2016 tax year.

SECTION 4: This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure in the interests of the public health, safety and welfare, for the reason that Council desires to have this legislation effective as soon as possible due to the 2016 tax year filing deadline is passed. As such an emergency measure, this ordinance shall take effect upon passage by Council and approval by the Mayor.

The Administration shall keep a written record of candidates interviewed, the date of interview, and retain the applications in the event Council inquires as to compliance with this Ordinance;
- Step 6: The administration shall select the successful candidate to hire for the position. Prior to being hired, the successful applicant shall be required to pass a drug test and receive the approval of the Police Chief of a Police Department and BCI background check. The Applicant shall bear the cost of the drug test and background checks;
- Step 7: The administration shall report the name of the successful applicant and his or her starting date to members of Council;
- Step 8: During annual budget preparations and reviews, council shall evaluate and determine if any positions are no longer necessary in light of declining population, finances, attrition, legal environment, etc. In addition to annual budget meetings to set budgets, Council shall have an annual review of the budgets of the city departments at the mid-point of each fiscal year.
