Ms. Marchese: Gypsy Lane

Mr. Mientkiewicz: I'm on the wrong one. Sorry.

Ms. Marchese: 45-17 is the Gypsy Lane.

Mr. Mientkiewicz: Okay.

President Marino: We had in the past, members of the audience, the auditors require us now to show in our financial statements when we receive grants, the acceptance of the grants and the payout. Whether the city pays the grant or not, we discussed that during our audit fiscal committee meetings and these are things that John and his leadership and his office are rectifying and making sure that we're doing things in conformity to law. So good job.

Auditor Merlo: As we get the notifications when they come in, we need council to appropriate so we can show as a revenue in and show it as an expenditure.

President Marino: Right.

Mr. Mientkiewicz: Just comes in and out right?

Auditor Merlo: In and out.

President Mario: Yeah.

Auditor Merlo: And that includes, I believe, storm water. There's some ROF money in there too

so.

Mr. Steffey: I would like to just mention that in talking to my colleagues and talking to the mayor and the service director, I think that it would really behoove our city to make sure that there are two signatures on any change orders or any changes of what we are expecting in service versus what we are paying for. I think that leaving that up to one person, who may or may not be qualified, to able to handle that. Checks and balances would, in my eyes, alleviates some of maybe the problems going forward as well as increasing the communication to council.

President Marino: Well, there's another consideration regarding two signatures. The auditor of the city must sign those.

Ms. Marchese: Exactly.

President Marino: Because we can cannot sign a change order without funds being there. Case in point. So, if the auditor was made aware through the change order process that these cost estimates were coming through, he could have fiduciary veto power to stop it to ensure that appropriations and our spending policies are adhered to. So, Mayor, you and Giovanne need to get together and figure out what process is going to be followed regarding any future construction projects or for that matter any projects in the city. Be it paving or water installations or whatever is going on, our auditor has to be fully informed of the finances because change orders, my experience has been generally you get a credit over here and it costs you a ton over there. So

Auditor Merlo: Just to be clear, with the building repairs on the interior the change orders for that, those were provided by Sekanick and both myself and the service director signed off on. So, those I was aware of. It's the ones in between the final bill for Servicemaster and the first bill of Servicemaster. There were in between invoices of work that was authorized to be done.

President Marino: John, this is just another indication of a lack of administrative control and administrative oversight in the city.

Auditor Merlo: I don't disagree with you.

President Marino: That's the bottom line. And I know council, we all get banged around for all of the sins of the past. In this case, every one of us were trying to keep a handle on what was going on and here again we have... there was a gap in administrative oversight.

Mr. Papalas: Mr. President, Ryan and I were talking about this before the meeting also. We are right in line with what you are saying Barry. What we're thinking is, at least two people sign off on these change orders even before they reach the auditor. Somewhere in the very beginning, Tom should have been on this and obviously wasn't. And we need to have this built in I don't know if we need to do with an ordinance or resolution or actually it's common sense but in this case that didn't happen.

President Marino: Well what happens is, devil's advocate, we sign the change orders.

Mr. Papalas: Yeah.

President Marino: You and I. And it goes up to him and he comes down and says "Bob and Steve, there's no money there to pay that." And we already signed it. The CFO of the city has to be involved in this process for budgeting purposes.

Mr. Papalas: Maybe three.

Mr. McNaughton: Well then maybe two in addition to the

President Marino: Well

Mr. Papalas: Correct. Three people then.

President Marino: Then the mayor

Mr. McNaughton: That's judge, jury and execution.

President Marino: Well, he carries a lot of financial authority.

Ms. Marchese: He has to be involved.

President Marino: All of it. When I said back at the beginning is the auditor and the mayor need to get together along with, I left out Terry Swauger I apologize, our law director and put some procedure together to ensure that this doesn't happen again. So, we're all saying the same thing. We're all on the same page.

Mr. Papalas: We are. We are. I have confidence that it won't happen again. We have a person whose more responsible than that and so forth but um in his place now. But just in case that happens or service director is ill and he is absent when the issue comes up what do we do. I'm concerned about that.

President Marino: I would like pick up with your last suggestion Steve is that whatever is done is passed by ordinance. Because what I've learned in spending my time with all of our friends.

Mr. Papalas: Yup.

President Marino: Is that if it's codified and someone breaks or violates the ordinance, they get the full effect of all of Ohio Revise Code and all of things that go with it so.

Mr. Papalas: Well

President Marino: So whatever you three come up with, I would hope that it would go to city council so it has legal teeth attached to it.

Mr. Papalas: Terry, can you can you consider this with us and draw something up roughly just to see what you think. If it's doable.

Law Director Swauger: I will do that. I will look at the contract language for most of the projects. My concern would making sure that if we get a grant that we are in compliance with whatever they require.

President Marino: Yeah.

Law Director Swauger: So that we don't pass an ordinance that gets us into trouble with federal grants or something of that nature. But I will look at the grants and get you guys some language or some kind of proposal in conjunction with Giovanne and the mayor.

Mr. Papalas: Okay.

Law Director Dull: That we can look at.

Mr. Papalas: That's very helpful. Thanks.

President Marino: Thank you.

It was moved by Steffey, seconded by Lastic to adopt this Draft No. 47-17.

President Marino: Stephanie, I read in the paper that we're going to now use the auto estimator for bills right?

Ms. Ford: Well I contacted the software company and got other options on how that works. And they did come to a conclusion that it would work.

President Marino: So, in a month we've figured that out?

Ms. Ford: Yes.

President Marino: Good. Okay. Thanks. Because I want to make sure that what I'm being told is 100% correct.

Ms. Ford: Yes they figured it out.

President Marino: Okay that's good.

Ms. Ford: It should be accurate.

President Marino: Well it better to accurate. It better be.

Ms. Ford: It will be.

President Marino: Good. Mayor, any comments?

Mayor Scarnecchia: Yes, I'd just like to restate I think, excuse me again, tonight thanks to the people of this town, we swore in three new patrolmen, a new captain and a new lieutenant. So, I thank the people of Niles. Other than that, that's it.

President Marino: Thanks mayor.

Chief Holland: I'd like to report that during the recent the snow parking ban, we issued the officers wrote over 50 citations and towed two vehicles that didn't respond to the actual citations.

President Marino: Thank you.

Mr. Papalas: Thanks chief.

Chief Danielson: I wanted to give council and update on the guy we have going through the testing for the 6th safer grant. He is moving right along and it looks like he should be hired for the 1st... week beginning April 2nd. He is doing his last test now and we couldn't get him done in time to get him ready for Sunday so it's looking like April 2nd he should be in the department.

Mr. Steffey: Great. Thanks chief.

President Marino: Thanks chief.

Mr. Lastic: Yes I just, you know, as a councilman you always say "why do we do this?" And tonight is Mr. Pezzano's birthday and he showed up at a council meeting. And he even had

Ms. Marchese: His wife.

Mr. Lastic: Told his wife I'm going to take you out on my birthday and she said good. However she didn't know it was a council meeting.

The other thing I want to ask about is this: Mayor, you submitted this letter, so what's the name change? And I see it capitalized- Name and Change. Is that the.

Mayor Scarnecchia: Name change. We've been working with groups and that are, once again, very interested. I'm trying to the best I can.

Mr. Papalas: What do you want done? What?

Mayor Scarnecchia: We want to take down the name. The current name on there and call it the Niles Wellness Center. For the simple reason, the groups or group that wants to come in and they are really interested to expand our procedures but they don't want... they don't like the name on the building.

Mr. Papalas: Okay. Do we want an ordinance brought in council as a whole?

Mayor Scarnecchia: You need an ordinance.

President Marino: The law director, Terry, would you guide them on what needs to take place for this.

Law Director Swauger: You would need an ordinance repealing your prior ordinance naming it that name.

Mr. Papalas: The ordinance that you brought in right, Tom. When you were on city council?

Law Director Swauger: There was an ordinance that was passed by council and you have to have council pass an ordinance repealing that ordinance.

Mr. Papalas: I remember that now.

Ms. Marchese: Plus would check with attorney Newman being that the park's board has full control of that and has to make sure I've checked with to make sure that before we do this.

Law Director Swauger: It doesn't matter. We named it.

Ms. Marchese: They wouldn't have to give a letter?

Law Director Swauger: You passed an ordinance naming. You can pass an ordinance repealing it.

Ms. Marchese: Okay that's what I needed to know.

Mr. Papalas: So, we need an ordinance. Do we.

Law Director Swauger: It needs to be council as a whole.

Mr, Lastic: Council as a whole.

Law Director Swauger: Or a committee would have sponsor that ordinace.

Mr. Papalas: Council as a whole?

Mr. Lastic: Yes

Ms. Marchese: Council as a whole?

Law Director Swauger: If you want, I will have my office draft an ordinance.

Mr. Papalas: Yeah.

Law Director Swauger: For all of you and make sure it's council as a whole.

Mr. Papalas: If this is going to facilitate somebody coming in.

Law Director Swauger: I will do that.

Mr. Papalas: Yes. Thank you Terry.

Law Director Swauger: You're welcome.

Mr. Papalas: I don't have any other comments.

Mr. McNaughton: Thanks. I just want to congratulate and welcome our new police officers in town as well as those who received their promotions. I know they worked extraordinarily hard and the great irony is that was a year ago tonight that we celebrated the passage of the levy. So, levy dollars at work. So thank you to the citizens for allowing that ceremony to happen tonight. Best of luck and continued success chief. That's it.

Ms. Marchese: Just real quick again congratulations. And chief also too as I was sitting here, I got another text. Apparently when you towed them on High street.

Chief Holland: I don't know where they towed them from.

Ms. Marchese: Oh okay well down at the bottom

Chief Holland: I know they towed some.

Ms. Marchese: The problem is still going. The minute the police leave, they go pull them right back out there. Even I just got four complaints on that so I thought let me bring it up now.

Chief Holland: Okay.

Ms. Marchese: Okay.

President Marino: Frank, may I ask one question? Actaully Tom, I need to talk to you right after. Mayor, can I talk to you right after the meeting? I want to ask you a question right after the meeting.

Mayor Scarnecchia: Certainly.

President Marino: Thank you. Mr. Pezzano. I was going to ask it here but I will just wait.

Mr. Pezzano: I just want to thank all of the departments in the city because I pretty much went to all of the departments this past month to help us out in the first ward and Mr. Crowley and Mr. Vigorito are working on something really big right now. And we are going to set up a meeting as soon as I get word from you two. Thanks a lot.
