Mark Hess: \$61,000.00 is going to be spent on two streets. We are going to do Erie and Mahoning, a part of Mahoning. Those are the only two streets we are going to do with this money. We are also applying for the Gypsy Lane project. It is a \$224,000.00 project that -- this was actually a project that was on the list of projects that didn't get done. We had applied for it, but we couldn't generate enough points, so it's just been sitting there and this project is

competitive and it doesn't mean we are going to get it, but the next ordinance there will be some money that we have to put towards this, which you'll see in the next ordinance.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE COMMITMENT OF \$26,000 FROM THE CITY OF NILES REVOLVING LOAN FUND FOR THE PY 2015 CDBG CRITICAL INFRASTRUCTURE PROGRAM; AND \$75,000 FROM THE REVOLVING LOAN FUND FOR THE PY 2015 CDBG ALLOCATION AND OHIO PUBLIC WORKS COMMISSION (OPWC) STREET RESURFACING PROGRAM; AND DECLARING IT AN EMERGENCY

President Marino: Before you take action, can we have a motion to amend \$26,000 to \$101,000, please?

Mark Hess: Well, actually it's correct the way it was.

President Marino: Terry passed out another one, so that it's clean for the record, it is \$101,000. It was moved by Stredney, seconded by Lastic to amend the caption to read \$101,000. Motion carried.

Mr. McCormick: When you were talking about that \$61,000, originally we were \$26,000, then I heard \$61,000.00 then \$101,000.

Mark Hess: No, it's a little bit confusing. The earlier Draft was for \$61,300 and it's going to go into the 2016 resurfacing. Typically we apply for Ohio Works Commission projects and normally we have money to have a local match and because we don't have that now, so that process is getting ready. I talked to the Mayor and he suggested that we try to find some city streets that we can possible include in a package that we can submit to Ohio Public Works Commission. We actually had to — in order for me to have a shot at that, I've got to have (inaudible), so I requested four city streets and I have this for Fifth Street, Third Street, Summit Street and Olive. Those accounts came back better than I thought in a range that we feel that we can put together an application to do those. In order for us to do that, though, we're going to need to put up 48% of whatever the total cost is. So if we look at the sheet that I passed out, we have \$407,000 in total project costs. The OPWC would pay \$220,000, \$61,300 from 2015 to put into this, \$75,000 from the revolving loan fund that's going to be put into this and that leaves the city's share for that project only \$51,000.

Mr. McCormick: All right.

Mayor Infante: The \$51,000 would come from the street fund.

Mr. McCormick: And that doesn't change what you intended to do this year?

Mark Hess: No.

Mr. Merlo: So we're making a commitment of \$101,000 and \$75,000?

Mark Hess: No. \$26,000 and \$75,000.

Mr. Merlo: So this was originally right? The \$26,000 and \$75,000?

Mark Hess: Yes. The one I have says \$26,000 and \$75,000.

Mr. Dull: When we were talking I misunderstood what you wanted.

President Marino: So we didn't need to change this?

Mr. Merlo: I make a motion to put it back at \$26,000 and \$75,000. Revert back to the original.

President Marino: Seconded by Stredney.

Motion carried.

Mr. McCormick: So we are going to vote on the original version and not the Amended version?

President Marino: Correct.

Mr. Dull: Just to clarify what Ed was asking. We are still using the Amended Draft No. 37-15.

Mr. McCormick: So we're changing the \$101,000 back to \$26,000?

Mr. Dull: Yes.

It was moved by Stredney, seconded by Merlo to suspend the rule requiring three readings.

The fire chief and Neil came up with a plan and we didn't have to go that way, but I want to thank all of you guys for a great job.
