AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE VACATION A PORTION OF LONG ALLEY

SECTION ONE: This Council finds that a petition signed by all property owners of property abutting Long Alley that runs 20' wide from the South Right of Way of Ford Street to the North Right of Way of Harris Street as further described in the Exhibit A has been presented to Council, praying that said portion of Long Alley be vacated. A copy of the Petition and Map are attached hereto as Exhibit A.

SECTION TWO: Council further finds that there is good cause for such vacation of that portion of Long Alley as prayed for, and that such vacation will not be detrimental to the general public interest, and ought to be made.

SECTION THREE: The portion of Long Alley designated on the petition attached hereto is hereby vacated, subject to statutory conditions, and the reservation to the City of Niles of all mineral rights therein.

SECTION FOUR: The Clerk of Council is directed to notify the Auditor of Trumbull County of the vacation, by sending him a copy of this Ordinance.

SECTION FIVE: : This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure in the interest of the public health, safety and welfare, for the reason that the vacation of the alley is necessary to realize grant funds for the area. 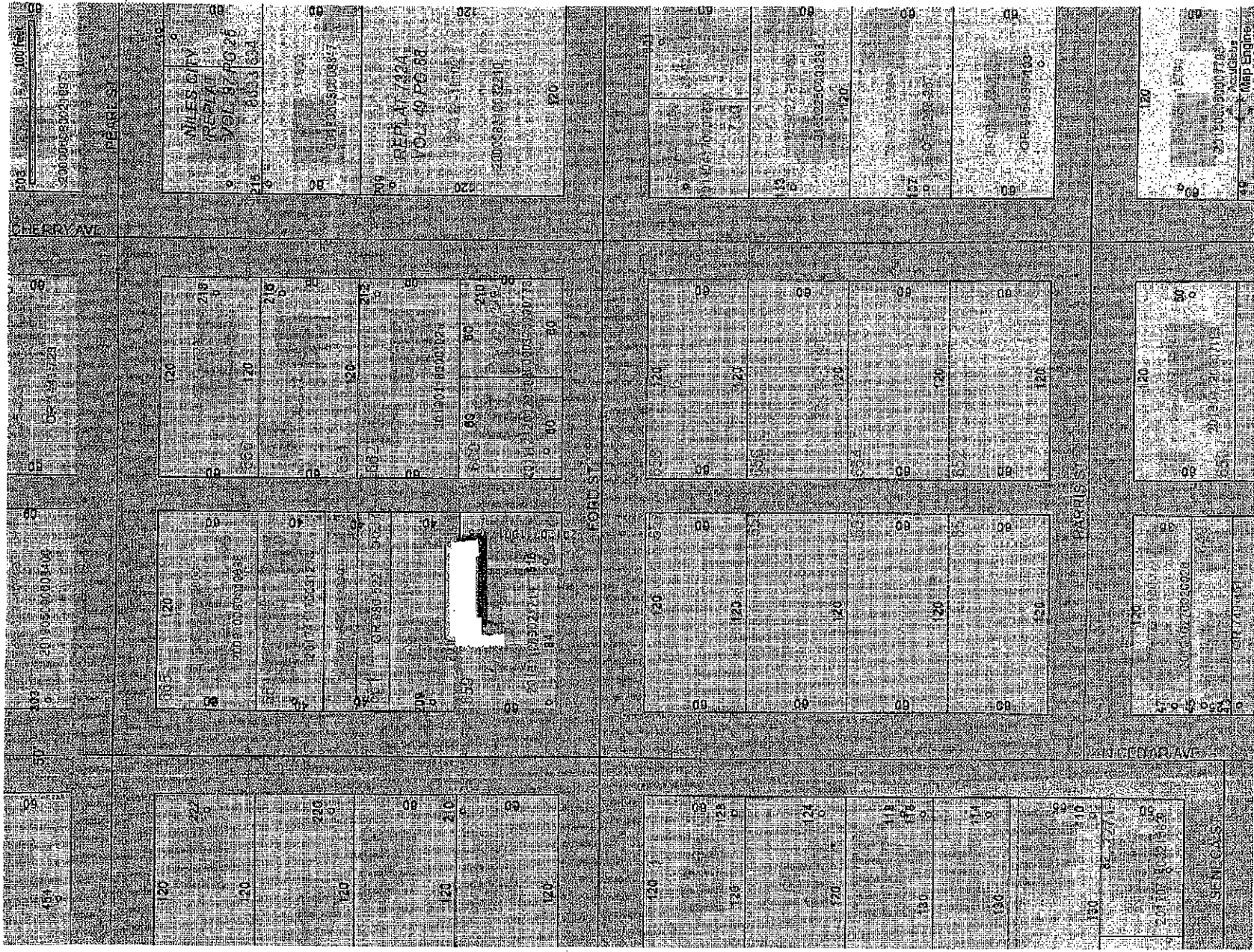

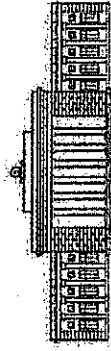


Dear Senator O'Brien,

On behalf of myself, our city leaders, and the entire Niles community, I would like to express my support for the initiative that Cadence Care Network, formerly Homes for Kids is bringing to downtown Niles, Ohio. Matt Kresic and his team have been actively involved with my plans to revitalize the downtown area and they have taken a shared approach by applying for funding, through your office, in the amount of \$60,000.00 from the Ohio State Capital Budget.

The state capital dollars will be used to repair and renovate a 6,082 square foot building, located at 43 North Main St. in downtown Niles, into a Family & Community Resource Center. The center will allow children and families, who are a high risk for child abuse and neglect, to receive early interventions and the appropriate treatment necessary to reduce their risk of entering the child welfare system via the implementation of evidence based parenting, behavioral health, and treatment services that align closely with the Family First Prevention Service Act. I ask you to strongly consider this initiative in this year's round of state funding to help make their vision become reality for the betterment of not only Cadence Care, but Niles as a whole.

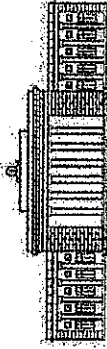



reconsider this decision and ensure the continuation of Minor League Baseball not only in Niles, but throughout communities across the country.

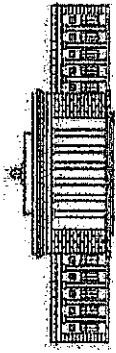
