Mr. Sheely said they need to hammer on the doors of the senators. He is going to make calls again and stay on this. He does not think this is right or fair at all.

Mr. Johnstone agreed and said many of the many council members have expressed their concerns and opposition. He encouraged the residents to get involved and call the state representatives on this issue and express their opposition also.
