Michael Boccia: Mr. Boccia lives near the vape show and he is at council tonight to complain about the shop. He said they are nothing but a nuisance. He has called three times about their radio, he has caught someone outside urinating on a car, and someone has thrown beer bottles in his yard. He wants to know why they haven't been fined yet. He said they should be to the point of being shut down because of the complaints and he wants the city to work on that. President Marino asked if he has spoken to the law director and Mr. Boccia said he hasn't received a call back from him yet.

President Marino said he will speak to the law director on his behalf and will ask the law director to get in touch with him. If need be, they will have a meeting to address this when the law director gets back into town. When he returns, he will make sure that the law director gets a hold of him.

Mr. Boccia also expressed his concern with all of the four-wheelers going up and down the road on Beaver Street. He wants to know why they are getting away with it when Girard and Warren hunt them down. President Marino said he would assume it is because of the no chase policy because they need to be careful with the police endangering their lives. President Marino said they will discuss this along with the concerns on the vape shop. President Marino asked him to leave his information with the clerk, and someone will get a hold of him.
