CITY ORDINANCE:

Off-street parking limited to hard surfaces: All motor vehicles, campers, boats, trailers, semitrailer, truck, vehicle and construction equipment shall be parked in an area consisting of asphalt, concrete or other impervious surface approved by the Building Inspector.

Flooding Tips

As the fall weather approaches, The City of Niles will make routine stops in your neighborhood to preform preventative maintenance on the city storm water and sanitary systems to alleviate flooding. This includes cleaning out catch basins and jetting out sewer lines. The most common cause of flooding is blockage in the storm sewer lateral lines from the house to the street, which is the resident's responsibility. Make sure your lateral is checked every three years by a contractor registered with the Niles Building Department. Always keep gutters and downspouts clean and free flowing. Make sure landscaping beds are sloped away from your house. This will help avoid ponding near the foundation of your house. Keep all exterior drain covers clear of leaves and other debris. Clean out driveway drains at least once a year. Do not pile leaves, branches, or other yard waste in the swale ditches around your property or along the edge of the roadway. Finally, do not blow leaves into the street or into storm sewers or catch basins.

Updates from the Safety Departments

Niles Police- Chief Jaison Holland

The Niles Police Department has received delivery of four 2020 Ford Police Interceptor Utility's. They have been fitted with emergency equipment and are patrolling the streets.

As of October 1st, department has logged 10,746 calls for service.

Niles Fire- Chief Dave Danielson

The Niles Fire Department was awarded the Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG) in the amount of \$95,238.09. As a condition of this grant, the city is required to contribute matching funds equal to or greater than 5.00 percent of the Federal funds awarded, or \$4,761.91 for a total approved budget of \$100,000.00. These funds will be earmarked for an exhaust system in the garage bay.

Did you Know???

Leaf and branch pick-up are included as a part of your trash service through Republic Services. During the autumn season, we are all hard at work to make our yards are looking great. Make sure to bag your leaves and place them at the curb on trash day. Try to limit your bags of leaves to ten per household, to avoid a special pick-up.

TIP: purchase paper biodegradable bags from your local hardware store.

Cut branches no longer than four feet and bundle them with the cut ends toward the street. Piles of branches should not be higher than four feet.



Mahoning River Corridor

The Mahoning River Corridor Initiative was created to promote economic development, recreation and conservation on the sites along the banks of the Mahoning River. Once the heart and soul of the Mahoning Valley, the



Mahoning River Corridor is now challenged by abandoned industry and underdeveloped infrastructure. The river was dammed up in numerous places to provide cooling water for the big steel industries that settled along the Mahoning River. From the 1960s to the early 1980s the big steel industry began to close its doors to the Valley, leaving behind memories for its hard workers and a legacy of pollution for the river that sustained them. Led by the corridor Mayor's, State officials, Eastgate, and the Port Authority, the goal of this initiative is to restore the Mahoning river as an asset, not a liability, to our region by offering quality water and recreation along the river. From Newton Falls, to Niles to Lowellville, the Mayor's are working collaboratively to remove the remaining low-head dams and restore the river to its natural, free flowing state. The first dam is currently being removed in Lowellville. This initiative is leveraged through state and federal funding, in hopes to attract a higher population not only on the river, but in many of the downtown areas along the Mahoning River, including Niles!

Notice to Residents:

Updates from the Service Departments

The Niles Street Department has been preparing snow and ice removal vehicles for the winter season. The street department has stocked up on nearly 1,000 tons of road salt throughout the summer and fall months. Through a purchasing consortium with Trumbull County, the city was able to purchase road salt at a price of \$68.00 per ton. This cost-saving measure allows us to purchase more, for less in an effort to keep our streets safe during winter.

The Niles water department continues to replace inoperable hydrants throughout the city. This is another progressive step that the city is taking to upgrade its' aged infrastructure. Please be patient as water service can be temporarily affected.

The Niles Light Department was recently recognized by AMP Ohio for job safety awareness. The department stays informed of the latest safety/OSHA regulations and policy changes. Employees are well versed on the newest and most effective equipment and tools, including grounding items, flame resistant (FR) gear, shot gun sticks, elbow pullers and lineman fall harnesses/climbing gear.



Update from the Court

The Niles Municipal Court continues to upgrade court technology. The court has installed court and probation kiosks together with a court monitor displaying the daily docket. This improvement, paid from court probation funds, has increased the efficiency of the court's experience with its customers.

Quarterly Financial Report

The City of Niles was recently awarded a clean financial audit from the Ohio Auditor of State for the 2018 fiscal year. Residents can view the full audit by visiting www.ohioauditor.gov/audits.

City finances continue to rebound strongly. At the beginning of the month, the General Fund balance was \$8,865,127.18. Through September, the city was at 74.37% of the total yearly budget with three months remaining in the fiscal year.

Total income tax net collected by R.I.T.A. as of Oct. 1, 2019 is \$8,109,195.47, including \$47,473.87 of penalties & interest collected during the Administrative Subpoena process that was recently conducted in our City. The City of Niles is ahead of 2018 tax collections by \$108,374.03, up to his point in the year. At this time last year, October finished out at a net of \$8,000,821.44. We are expecting the 2019 year-end collections to finish out higher!

The City has earned \$356,834.74 to date on its 2019 Interest Investments. This figure is \$209,952.31 more than last year for the same time period, where the City earned only \$146,882.43. We are on course to earn \$469,000.00, plus, for 2019, unless there is a dramatic shift in interest rates over the next three months.
