-All fences shall not be erected closer than the one foot to the property line.

-All types of fences shall have a finished appearance on the side facing a neighboring property, or the street.

Waddell Park Grant

The City of Niles was recently awarded a federal grant for Waddell Park Improvements, in the amount of 2.55 million dollars. These funds were made available through the Office of Congressman Tim Ryan. The funding is earmarked through the 2023 federal Presidential Budget.



The City of Niles has undertaken an initiative to improve the city park system, focusing on facilities, beautification, health and safety. The goals are to enhance facility features that promote a healthy community, incorporate an attractive landscape, and allow residents to enjoy a quality-of-life activities in a comfortable setting.

The grant funding is specifically earmarked for Waddell Park Improvements with the following individual project budget breakdown:

City Planning & Grant Writing

The city has created a new position within the administration dedicated to planning and grant writing. This position is accountable for comprehensive zoning and planning, grant writing for various departments, and capital infrastructure plans. The position is responsible for overseeing the city's GIS mapping system and will work on EPA stormwater plans. A focus on researching and exploring new revenue streams to offset local dollars is a key factor with this position. You can reach the Planner/Grant Coordinator at 330-544-9000 ext.1601.

Did You Know:

Niles residents can register to receive text alerts for severe weather, community events, and emergencies including power outages, water break/boil alerts, traffic delays, and AMBER alerts. To sign up, visit the homepage of the city website.

City residents may place up to ten tires and rims in the bin located behind the Police Station.

Energy Savings Tips

With the summer heat in full swing, these simple steps can help you save energy and money while keeping your family cool:

Set the Thermostat- Turn your thermostat up a few degrees. Adjusting the temperature is one of the most effective ways to reduce cooling costs. Installing smart thermostats can help you monitor and adjust the temperature in your home so that you save energy while you're away or asleep.

Close Blinds- Keeping window coverings shut during the hottest parts of the day can help reduce your home's overall temperature.

Reduce Appliance Use- Avoid using appliances that produce heat, like ovens and dryers, when it's hot outside. You can reduce cooling costs simply by changing your everyday habits. Unplugging appliances or using smart power strips in your home can also lead to savings.

Use a Fan- Use your ceiling fan and set it to rotate counter clockwise so that it pushes cool air down. Ceiling fans create a wind chill effect, making you feel comfortable without using excess energy. This can help make your room feel up to 10 degrees cooler.

Keep Vents Clear- Move any furniture that may be blocking the vents around your home and be sure to check that they are open and free of any dust. This will allow your cooling system to circulate air more effectively.

Seal and Insulate- Conduct a thorough inspection for air leaks around your home. Consider installing weatherstrips on the bottom of externally-facing doors and caulking the edges of your windows to prevent the loss of any cool air. You want to air condition your home, not the outdoors.

CMAQ

The City of Niles was recently awarded a federal Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality grant in the amount of 2.2 million dollars.

The grant is dedicated to the downtown area and the scope of work is for signalization and infrastructure upgrades from State Street to North Road. The proposed improvements include reconstruction of seven existing traffic signals including mast arms, cabinets, controller units, vehicle and pedestrian detection, pedestrian signal heads, and communications.

Traffic signal coordination will also be implemented from State Street to Federal Street including optimized phasing and timing plans. Sign installations which currently exist will be replaced on the new mast arms or other acceptable locations.

Project design and engineering is underway with final plans being completed in 2024. Construction will be completed by 2025.

NECO Water Metering Hardware

NECO will be continuing the water meter transmitter (MIU) and register head maintenance program this Summer. If you receive a letter from NECO, please contact the company to schedule your appointment. This will ensure that you are receiving actual reads on your monthly water bill. Look closely to be sure your bill is labeled actual (ACT) and not estimate (EST). If you receive an estimated (EST) bill, immediately contact the Niles Utility Billing Office so that one of our service representatives can schedule, inspect, and replace your metering hardware.

The Niles Police Department was recently awarded \$262,350 in state grant funding. This funding is associated with the Ohio Violent Crime Reduction Grant Program. Funding will be used to aid in police officer retention to ensure that staffing in the department remains at full strength. It is geared toward a continuing effort to prevent and investigate volent crimes within the City of Niles.

Quarterly Financial Report

The city continues to maintain strong fiscal oversight, in regard to income tax collections and expenditures of tax-payer dollars. The General Fund balance after the second quarter is at \$12,665,990.48. The enterprise funds include utility revenue from water, light, and sewer customers. The current balance for the Light fund is approximately 17.1 million dollars, the Water fund balance is approximately 4.2 million dollars, and the Sewer fund balance forward is approximately 4.8 million dollars. Our goal is to continue to grow these funds, while aggressively reinvesting back into our aged infrastructure and keeping our utility rates stable for Niles utility customers. Total net income tax revenue throughout the second quarter of 2022 is \$5,851,497.42.

City wide overtime through the second quarter of 2022 came in at \$282,324.23, which is within budget. This number reflects emergency services for snow and ice removal, water break repairs, sewer backups, power outages, and police/fire overtime.
