



Disability Sign Policy

The City of Niles will install child disability warning signage along roadways to protect the health, safety and welfare of children.

To request disability warning signage for a Deaf/Blind child or child with Autism near public roadways and on the public right-of-way (within city limits, only), contact the Mayor's Office at (330) 544-9000 ext. 1101 from 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

One (1) child with disability warning sign may be installed by City of Niles operations, per the Director of Public Safety.

Disability signage shall not intrude onto private property and must remain in the public right-of-way.

Disability signage shall be installed on a property with a residing child under the age of eighteen (18), as per Federal and State guidelines.

The child must live in a residence on a residential street where the speed limit is thirty-five (35) mph or less and the daily traffic volume is less than 2,000 vehicles on average.

A parent or legal guardian must provide a note from a medical professional attesting that the sign is for the safety of the child's medical condition.

City of Niles operations reserves the right to verify that the child maintains residence at the location and is under the age of eighteen (18), as per Federal and State guidelines.

City of Niles operations reserves the right to remove disability signage if residence of the child changes or the child is over the age of eighteen (18), as per federal and state guidelines.

Please contact the Mayor's Office if the child moves from the residence where the sign is located or when the child turns eighteen (18). City of Niles Operations will relocate the disability sign if the child moves within the City of Niles.
