

MISSION STATEMENT OF THE NILES FIRE DEPARTMENT

THE OVERALL MISSION OF THIS DEPARTMENT IS TO EDUCATE THE PUBLIC IN THE PREVENTION OF FIRES
COUPLED WITH MINIMIZING THE LOSS OF LIFE AND PROPERTY CAUSED BY FIRES AND EMERGENCIES OF
ANY NATURE BY WAY OF TRAINING, KNOWLEDGE, SKILL, AND AGGRESSIVE INTERVENTION KNOWN
ONLY TO OUR PROFESSION.

CHIEF'S MESSAGE

- THE CITY OF NILES FIRE DEPARTMENT IS A FULL-TIME DEPARTMENT WITH 30 FIREFIGHTERS AND A CHIEF THAT OPERATES FROM TWO STATIONS PROVIDING FIRE SUPPRESSION, VEHICLE EXTRICATION, LIMITED TECHNICAL RESCUE, FIRE INVESTIGATION, FIRE PREVENTION AND INSPECTION, BASIC LIFE SUPPORT /FIRST RESPONDER EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES, CERTIFIED CAR SEAT INSTALLATION, AND HAZARDOUS MATERIAL CONTAINMENT. FIREFIGHTERS WORK 24-HOUR SHIFTS AND THEN ARE OFF FOR 48 HOURS COVERING THE CITY 365 DAYS A YEAR.
- THE NILES FIRE DEPARTMENT STARTED 2024 OFF AT OUR AUTHORIZED STRENGTH OF 31 FIREFIGHTERS. BRIAN MORELLO RETIRED IN MAY AFTER SERVING THE DEPARTMENT FOR 28 YEARS AND THEN JOHN VLOSICH RETIRED IN OCTOBER AFTER SERVING THE DEPARTMENT FOR 34 YEARS. KYLE HAMMON WAS HIRED IN SEPTEMBER AND JASON KOCHES IN DECEMBER TO FILL THOSE OPEN POSITIONS.
- THE 2024 CALL VOLUME INCREASED 431 EMERGENCY CALLS FROM THE PREVIOUS YEAR, FOR A TOTAL OF 3218 CALLS. AVERAGE RESPONSE TIMES FROM TIME OF CALL TO TIME ON SCENE REMAIN IN THE 4-MINUTE RANGE.


2024 NILES FIRE DEPARTMENT ANNUAL RUN NUMBERS



MONTHLY CALL VOLUME


CALL VOLUME BY STATION

PERSONNEL


The personnel of the Niles Fire Department have many different types of specialty certifications such as Paramedics, Emergency Medical Technicians, and Emergency Medical Responders to cover medical incidents. For the prevention side, we have 4 Certified Fire and Life Safety Inspectors and 4 Certified Fire Investigators. We also have two Certified Car Seat Installers to help new parents secure their children into their vehicles properly. Some firefighters have furthered their education in the fire service to include certifications like Fire Instructor, Fire Officer courses, Rope rescue, Hazardous material courses and many other specialty trainings to better the NFD.

LOOKING TO 2025

Moving into 2025, the Niles Fire Department will continue efforts to keep the stations and equipment updated and in good working condition. Here are some of the plans we have for the upcoming year:

- Repair and paint interior walls of apparatus bay at Station 8
- Epoxy apparatus bay floor at Station 8
- Upgrade speaker system at both stations. These speakers are throughout the stations and transmit emergency calls over them.
- Purchase an additional combination cutter/spreader extrication tool to carry on the new Engine 7
- Purchase 8 sets of firefighting gear
 - o 2 sets will be for new hires
 - o 6 sets to update current firefighter's gear
- Purchasing more fitness equipment for both stations
- Updating portable radios
- Updating two desktop computers at Station 7

The department will continue to solicit funds from businesses through the National Fire Safety Council for the purpose of providing educational fire safety materials for the citizens of our community with an emphasis on young children. We provide educational fire safety talks and materials to around 500 children a year.

Our Fire Inspection Bureau has a hand in inspecting most of the new businesses that come to the City of Niles. They also provide the required annual fire and life safety inspections for the schools and other businesses that must meet requirements from the State of Ohio.
